Project Description:

1,700 sq. ft.. renovation. This project involved the renovation of an existing office space into Athletic Department Offices. The program included built-in trophy case, reception, offices, team meeting room and copier/storage.

700 sq. ft.. renovation. This project involved the renovation of an existing second floor office space into a full service alumni room located in the Athletic Center. The program consisted of a 12 seat conference table, dining/service counter, lighting and sound system for presentations, and full height vertical glazing for viewing athletic center basketball courts below.

ALUMNI ROOM OFFICIALLY DEDICATED

The Alumni Room, located on the second floor of Tansey Gym, was officially dedicated this fall with a ribbon-cutting ceremony on September 10. Invited guests included President John Van Domelen, members of the Wentworth Alumni Association Board of Directors, staff, and donors, who supported the project's fundraising drive. The renovations, which include the athletic offices and adjacent classroom, were funded, in part, through gifts from more than 800 Wentworth alumni.

The Alumni Room project is especially significant because Wentworth alumni were involved in every phase of the project. Howard V. Levine, AET '72, AE '74 and Chuck Cramer, BC '68 of the firm, Cramer, Levine

and Co., drew up the plans for the room; William Creelman, BC '64, and Dennis Fields, BCS '81, of Macomber Construction oversaw the actual renovations and construction; and Cathy (Mack) Camuso, IDS '92, added the finishing touches.
